

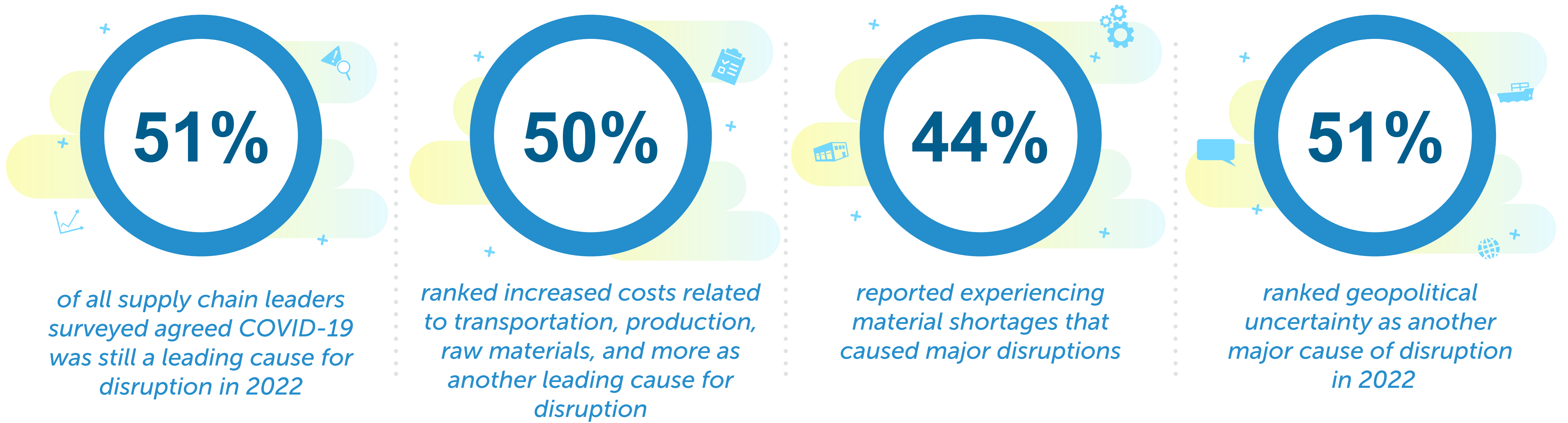
The State of Supply Chains

What have supply chain leaders learned from past disruptions? And what are their priorities for 2023?

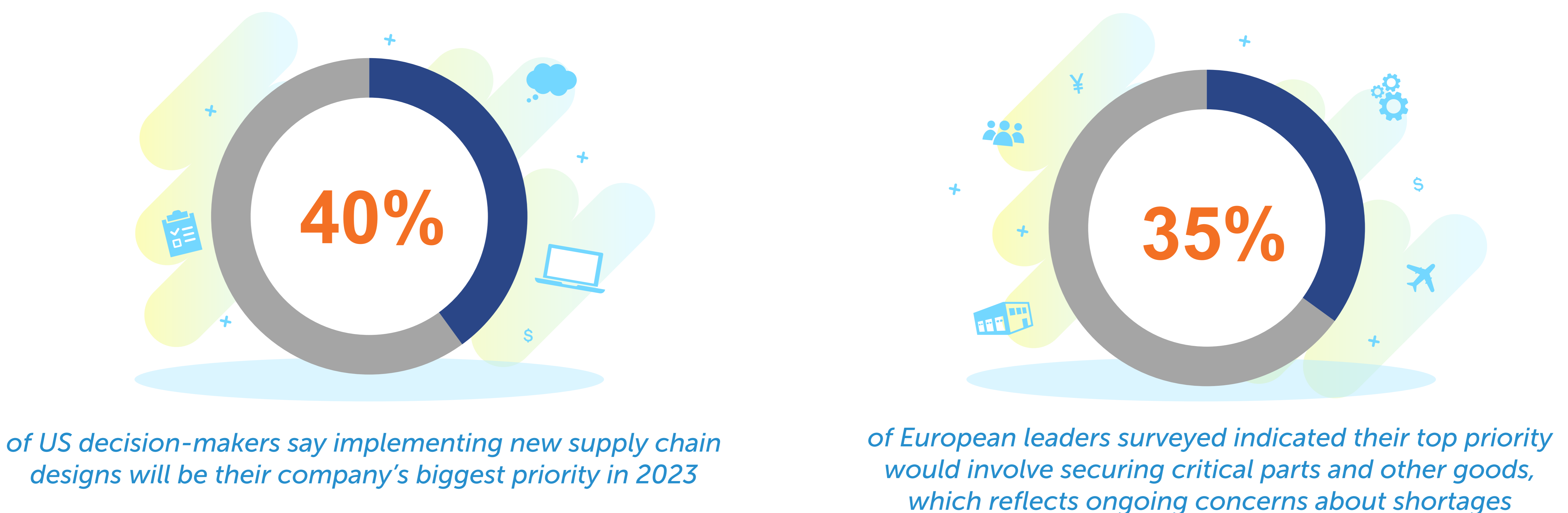
Leaders attributed disruptions to the ongoing impact of COVID-19, increased costs, material shortages, and geopolitical uncertainties.



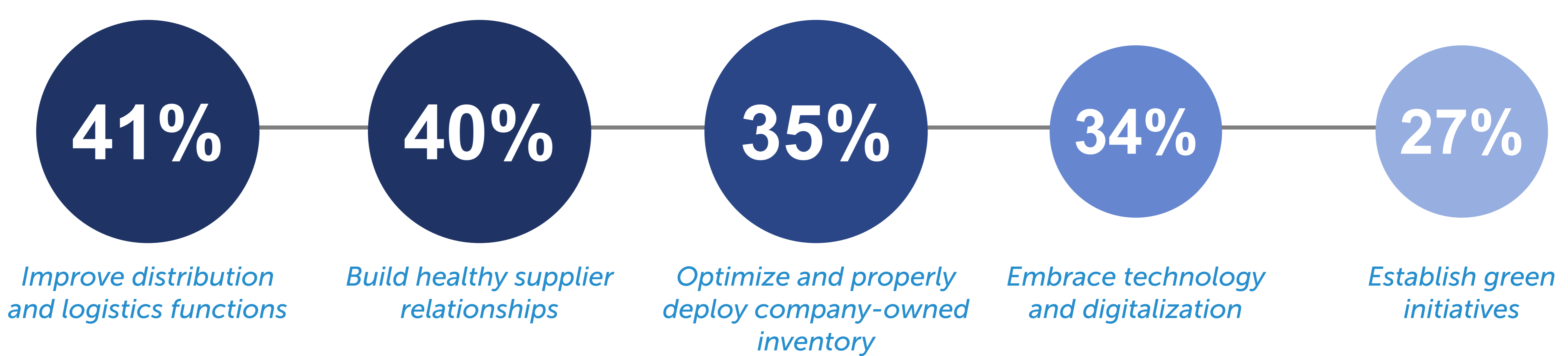
Concerns over rising costs, geopolitical uncertainties, and labor shortages are ranking in the top five expected challenges.



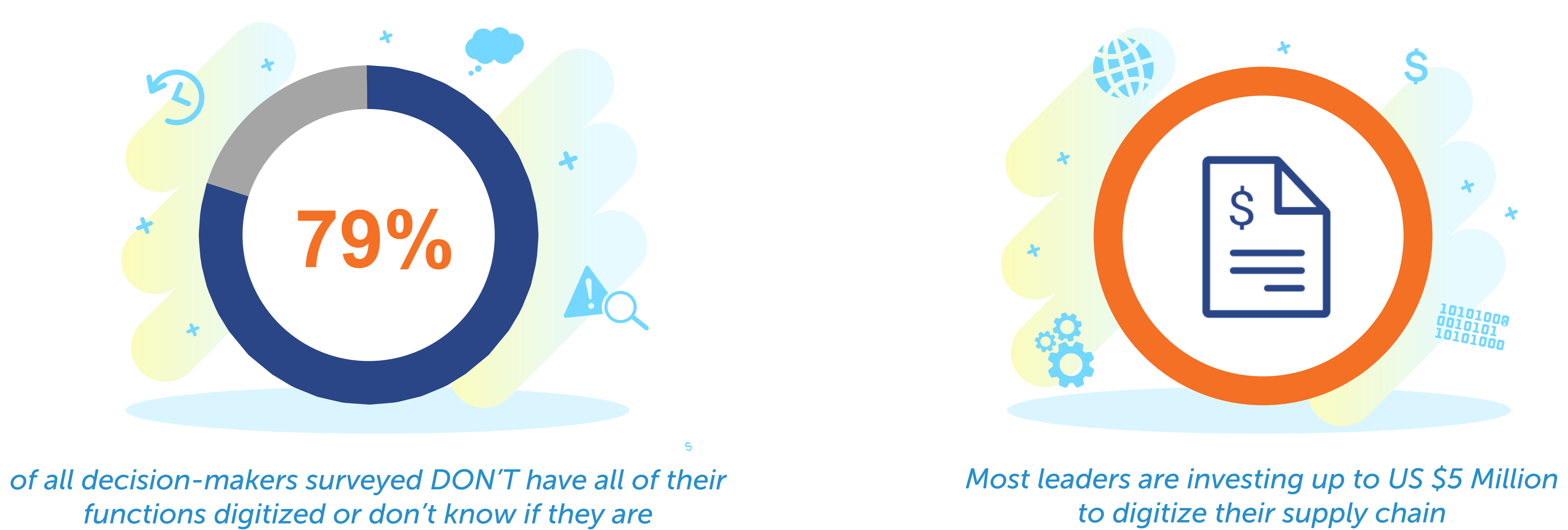
Priorities Also Vary by Geography
